MINUTES CITY OF SALEM CITY COUNCIL MEETING AUGUST 20, 2018

I. <u>CALL TO ORDER</u>

The regular August 20, 2018 meeting of the City Council was convened at 6:00 p.m., and called to order by Mayor Rex Barbee.

II. PRAYER AND PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Opening prayer was given by Councilwoman Sue Morgan, followed by the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

III. PRESENTATION OF PETITIONS/PUBLIC COMMENTS

Paul Albert indicated he is a 100% disabled veteran, and he uses a scooter to get around town. Many of the sidewalks are pitted and rough. Others have no access ramps. Mr. Albert indicated he often has to use the road, and he feels he is entitled to the same rights to safe travel as others. Mayor Barbee indicated any new sidewalks the City installs are now ADA accessible, but the city has a lot of sidewalks. Barbee asked Mr. Albert if he could provide a list of the sidewalks that he travels regularly and what issues he has found. Mr. Albert said he has 32 photographs he can provide.

Approval for Relay for Life Use of Nature Trail – October 20, 2018
 Motion was made by Councilman Farley and seconded by Councilman Koehler to approve
 Relay for Life's use of the Nature Trail for a 5KI on October 20th. Roll call vote: AYES:
 Councilman Morton, Councilwoman Morgan, Councilman Koehler, Councilman Farley, Mayor
 Barbee. NAYS: None. Motion carried.

2. Second Reading – Approval of Ordinance Increasing the Maximum Number of Class G Liquor

Councilwoman Morgan indicated she is not in favor of increasing the maximum number of Class G liquor licenses as we seem to have plenty of gaming establishments. Morgan suggested starting a list of entities who would like to have a Class G license and making one available when one is surrendered. Councilman Koehler added that he is not in favor either. Mayor Barbee indicated he is not opposed to the sale of liquor, but hates to permit another gaming site. Councilman Farley indicated he is not advocating for increased gaming sites, but he feels a lounge would be a nice addition to Days Inn. Councilman Morton indicated he is not in favor of increasing the number of places that can have gaming, and there are other hotels that do not have lounges. *Motion was made by Councilman Farley to increase the number of Class G liquor licenses by one to be issued to Legends. The motion failed for lack of a second.*

3. Purchase Approval – City Hall Façade Repair

Mayor Barbee indicated only one bid was received for the Façade Repair project, and it was from R & W Builders, Inc. in the amount of \$98,400.00 for the material specified with a deduction of \$42,400.00 to substitute Omega Panels. Mayor Barbee indicated the architect on the project, Ben Poirier, has approved the substitution. *Motion was made by Councilwoman Morgan and seconded by Councilman Morton to award the bid to R & W Builders, Inc. using the substitute material proposed for a total of \$56,000. Roll call vote: AYES: Councilwoman Morgan, Councilman Koehler, Councilman Farley, Councilman Morton, Mayor Barbee. NAYS: None. Motion carried.* Mayor Barbee indicated he's sure the City Manager will be contacting Council regarding colors.

4. Second Reading – Approval of Ordinance Making Amendments to Chapter 10

Mayor Barbee indicated City Manager Gruen has requested that this item be tabled, since he cannot be present.

5. Bills Payable
