**MANAGER'S COMMENTS**

**V. City Council Action**

2. C. Bud Davis, d/b/a Mt. Vernon Yacht Club is requesting permission to utilize the Salem Reservoir to operate remote controlled boats on the Salem Reservoir. Boats would range from 12" to 32". The boats are all battery operated and the club would provide instruction on the operation of the boat, boats for all skill levels for a nominal cost of \$5.00 per person unless he can get some sponsorship to cover cost and make it free to kids of all ages. Operations would run from 1pm to 6pm on Saturday's from April through September of 2020. They have successfully operated at locations in Mt. Vernon, and Centralia and are looking to expand their area.
3. Council recently enacted a "no parking" ordinance on West Alley from the 200 block to the 500 block. Paul Polanski is requesting that the "no parking" be removed from the 200 block to facilitate the business location that was formerly Hawley's furniture and collectables. The other three blocks are all zoned as residential but the 200 block is zoned for business.
4. Public Works would like to amend the scope of the road work on West Whittaker Street to the 300 and 400 blocks where the old Brown Shoe Factory was located. This will alleviate disruption to the Dairy Queen restaurant and still retain the original intent to straighten out the jog in the road at South College and allow for improvement of storm sewer drainage at the site. This project will be utilizing the FAU dollars from the ILDOT.
5. First reading – 2020 Property Tax Levy in the amount of 1.04999%. A second reading would be on the agenda for October 21 and the tax levy would be on the agenda for an approval vote on November 4<sup>th</sup>. The amount for the Library levy is included in the 1.04999% figure.
